The curriculum, offered via distance-education technology, meets the needs of working professionals who, because of the rapidly aging population, find themselves caring for a growing number of older adults.

The Hartford Program in Rural Gerontological Practice is a program of specialized preparation for graduate-level social work students preparing for careers as leaders in gerontological practice.
