The online Certificate in Grandfamilies Leadership program provides core education, technical support, and leadership development for professionals delivering grandfamily and kinship programming across the country.

- Accurately assessing the needs of grandfamilies and identifying resources to meet those needs
- Essential skills needed to deliver high-quality services

How to Sign Up

- The spring 2025 course will run February to May 2025.

- Registration will be capped to allow participants the opportunity for online discussion with colleagues in the field.
- Participants will complete 11 modules over a 14-week period.
- Break weeks are built in to accommodate busy work schedules.
